• **MSU Dissertation Completion Fellowships** – Contact the office of the college associate dean for research of your college to learn the college's procedure for awarding these fellowships. Dissertation to be finished during tenure of the fellowship; 20 fellowships awarded annually. Award: \$6,000.

• **MSU International Predissertation Travel Awards** – Supports travel abroad to the doctoral student's intended dissertation research site for a minimum of 60 days. (Applicants must provide a strong rationale for a shorter time.) A main purpose of this award is to help prepare MSU graduate students to develop competitive dissertation proposals in national fellowship competitions of the Fulbright, NSF, SSRC and similar programs. Award amount (from \$1,000 to \$5,000) depend on cost of the travel and related expenses. Kellogg Biological Station (KBS) Long-Term Ecological Research (LTER) Graduate Fellowships –

1) **LTER Capstone Graduate Fellowship:** The fellowship is open to PhD students enrolled at MSU who are interested in extending their LTER based research or in developing an aspect of their research to include LTER-related activities that would not otherwise be part of their dissertation work. Stipend of \$30,000 plus tuition.

2) **LTR Summer Research Fellowships:** Two awards of \$8,000 each with up to \$2,000 for travel. • **Walker Hill International Scholarship** – For predissertation visits to the site of the doctoral research in a country outside the U.S. (For international students, research in one's own country does not qualify.) Whittier Endowed International Health Scholarship Fund – Six \$500 awards for MSU graduate students (Masters or PhD Level) or students in the MSU College of Osteopathic Medicine or Human Medicine, or an MSU professional student for international health research (graduate level) or international health clerkships. May be used for travel but not for research "in one's own country." **Deadline:** November 4, 2011.

MSU Gender, Justice, and Environmental Change Fellowships – Dissertation research and completion fellowships of \$10,000. MSU Canadian Studies Doctoral Student Research Award – Grants of up to \$10,000 to conduct part of their research in Canada and to integrate the research findings into the applicant's conference presentations. III. A. Individual Grant Opportunities funded by the U.S. Government Agencies

Fulbright U.S. Student Programs for Language and Cultural Study or Dissertation Research Abroad ("Fulbright IIE awards"), Teaching Assistant, Critical Language, and Others –

For all Fulbright awards, current MSU students **must** submit applications through MSU. Contact MSU Fulbright Advisor Prof. Roger Bresnahan (bresnaha@msu.edu; 517.432.8244), Room 201A International Studies and Programs. The *MSU deadline* is **September 23, 2011 for all awards for submitting the one-page personal essay, two-page statement of grant purpose, and a single page on your courses, language, and experience related to your grant or study topic and the foreign country.** MSU faculty panels will review and rank the proposals. - **Full grants in academic fields and in the creative and performing arts and writing** – Offers 9-12 months to recent BS/BA graduates (graduating seniors) and doctoral students, young professionals, and artists for personal development and international experience to conduct study and/or research in one country for one academic year. Awards provide round-trip transportation, language or orientation courses where appropriate, maintenance allowance, and supplemental health and accidental insurance. Applicants must be a U.S. citizen or Permanent Resident. - **Full Grants for English Teaching Assistantships (ETAs)** – In more than 65 countries, ETAs are placed in schools or universities outside of capital cities, assigned to improve their students' language abilities and knowledge of the U.S., are integrated into the host community to increase their language skills and knowledge of the host country. ETAs may pursue individual study/research plans in addition to ETA responsibilities. http://us.fulbrightonline.org/thinking_teaching.html

- **Travel-Only Grants for Italy, Germany, and Hungary** – Only to supplement any other award that does not provide for international travel. Students fund their own study or research. http://us.fulbrightonline.org/program_country.html?id=54

- **Full Fulbright-mtvU Awards** – Four awards to conduct research around an aspect of international musical culture. Projects should focus on contemporary or popular music as a cultural force for expression. Preference will be given to recent graduates. - **Fulbright Critical Language Enhancement Award** – Opportunity for Fulbright U.S. Student Program grantees to receive three to six months of intensive language study in addition to their research or study grants. Only select languages and host-countries are available for this opportunity. Eligible Languages: Arabic (all dialects), Bahasa Indonesia, Bangla/Bengali, Chinese (Mandarin only), Gujarati, Hindi, Marathi, Punjabi, Russian, and Urdu. - **Fulbright Business Grants** –

Fulbright-Fogarty Fellowships in Public Health – Collaborative Fellowships with U.S. NIH to promote expanding research in public health and clinical research in Sub-Saharan Africa (Botswana, Malawi, and South Africa) and in 2012-13 in Asia and Latin America. • **Other Fulbright Country-Specific Awards** (*Indicate as SPECIAL PROGRAMS in application*)

Africa, Sub-Saharan – Full Fulbright awards are made to countries in Sub-Saharan Africa, with the exception of South Africa, and will be made based on the quality of the applications, rather than per-country quotas. Distribution of awards to countries in the region will vary annually according to the caliber of the applicants. Grants are not available to: Angola, Burundi, Cape Verde, Central African Republic, Comoros, Djibouti, Equatorial Guinea, Eritrea, Gabon, Gambia, Guinea, Guinea-Bissau, Ivory Coast, Liberia, Madagascar, Mauritania, Sao Tome and Principe, Seychelles, Somalia, Sudan, or Zimbabwe. Australia: CSIRO – Grants at all levels to enroll in Master's or Ph.D. programs, while conducting research) or undertake specific research projects (independently or related to their U.S. postgraduate studies). Others are graduating seniors undertaking research, prior to entering graduate school.

Ireland: Irish Language - A working knowledge of written and spoken Irish language is required. Grants for 11 months (July to June) with one month language immersion program in an Irish-speaking (Gaeltacht) region followed by a 9-month post-graduate degree through Irish in a relevant Irish university/college. Italy: Slow Foods – Fulbright English Teaching Assistantships and program of Study at the University of Gastronomic Sciences for Master in Food Culture: Communicating Quality Products. Proficient knowledge of the Italian language is strongly recommended in view of social interaction and additional activities. Grants for one year beginning in September 2012 or March 2013. Preference is for graduating seniors.

Italy: 18 awards at all levels for study of contemporary topics, science and technology, and entrepreneurship; for deafness studies; teaching assistantships; and other fields. Mexico: Graduate Degree Awards – Two graduate degree awards for candidates seeking to complete a Master's or Ph.D. degree at a Mexican university or qualified academic institution in all fields except Medicine, Veterinary Medicine, and Dentistry. Applications in Public Policy or Public Administration are particularly welcomed. Three awards for students conducting fieldwork or research in public administration or public policy. Nine BiNational Business awards for candidates with a Bachelor's in business administration, finance, economics, international relations, engineering, pre-law/international law, accounting, or some other business-related field and some work experience are preferred. Candidates with graduate studies (e.g., MBA, JD) as well as candidates with a Bachelor's degree in other fields, with a demonstrated interest in business will also be considered. Nine English Teaching Assistantships awards.

Netherlands: 16 Fulbright Full Awards plus Water Management Award for candidates at all levels for research relating to flooding. (Other water management areas not included.) Also various research awards in finance, childhood cancer, Ph.D.-level research in Computer Science, Electrical Engineering, Mechanical Engineering, Mathematics or Physics, and other fields.

Fulbright-Hays Doctoral Dissertation Research Abroad (DDRA) Fellowship Program (US/ED) –

Fellowships of \$10,000-\$70,000 (averaging \$27,000) for graduate students spending 6-12 months in full-time dissertation research abroad in modern foreign languages and area studies. Applications **must** be submitted through MSU. Contact Prof. Roger Bresnahan (bresnaha@msu.edu; 517.432.8244), International Studies and Programs, Room 201A. *Check ISP website for MSU deadline for reviewing proposals. **Deadline:** Possibly November, 2011. **Note:** FY 2011 grant competition was cancelled. Jacob K. Javits Fellowship – Up to four years of support for graduate study at the doctoral or Master of Fine Arts level in a selected field of the arts, humanities, or social sciences. Eligibility is limited to U.S. citizens and permanent residents or any citizens of any one of the Freely Associated States. For fiscal year 2011, the maximum stipend will be \$43,755, and the institutional payment is estimated to be \$13,755. **Last deadline:** September 30, 2010 Check website for information about future competitions.

International Research and Exchanges Board (IREX) Individual Advanced Research Opportunities (IARO) Program – U.S. citizens who are affiliated full-time with a North American college or university are eligible for academic exchange programs in Central and Eastern Europe, Eurasia, and Mongolia. The IARO Program is available to graduate students. Applicants can propose to do research in up to three countries (in Eastern Europe and Eurasia) for up to 9 months. Award: housing allowance and round-trip transportation. **Last deadline:** November 17, 2010. Deadline will be announced in September.

National Science Foundation Doctoral Dissertation Research Improvement (DDRI) – Dissertation support or indirectly through awards made to faculty. NSF awards are made by various NSF Directorates and Divisions, with *varying deadlines for each academic discipline twice annually, beginning September 2010*. Citizenship for DDRI awards is unrestricted. Submission of DDRI awards must be done electronically via Fastlane, with faculty advisor as PI and **must** be completed by the MSU Contract and Grant Administration (CGA) office; leave at least 7-to-10 days to manage electronic submission. • **Directorate for Social, Behavioral, and Economic Sciences (SBE) Doctoral Dissertation Research Grants**

– Awards are made to undertake significant data-gathering projects and to conduct field research in settings away from their campus that would not otherwise be possible in the following fields: archaeology; cultural anthropology; physical anthropology; economics; geography; linguistics; political science; sociology; law and social science; Decision, Risk & Management Sciences; Methodology, Measurement, and Statistics; Research on Science and Technology Surveys and Statistics; Science, Technology, and Society; and Science of Science and Innovation Policy. **Deadlines are twice a year and vary by discipline.** Check website.

● **Developing Global Scientists and Engineers: International Research Experiences for Students (IRES) and Doctoral Dissertation Enhancement Projects (DDEP)** — IRES supports research by groups of U.S. undergraduate or graduate students in collaboration with international partners. Proposals must be submitted by a faculty advisor for activities beginning at least six months after the target date. DDEP is for individual dissertation research with one international collaborator. *Deadline for DDEP: continuous; for IRES: full proposal target dates of September 15 and February 15 annually.*

● **The East Asia and Pacific Summer Institutes** – Provides graduate students with first-hand research experience in Australia, China, Japan, Korea, New Zealand or Taiwan. For Master's, medical, or doctoral students at any stage. \$5,000 plus travel funding. *Deadline: November 9, 2011.*

● **NSF Graduate Research Fellowship Program (GRFP)** – Provides three years of support for graduate study leading to research-based master's or doctoral degrees and is intended for students who are in the early stages of their graduate study. Includes physical and social sciences. Also, the **GRF Nordic Research Opportunity** is available to GRFP Fellows as a Supplemental Award to establish collaboration with research institutions in Norway or Finland. *Deadlines vary by field; all fall between August 15, 2011 and February 15, 2012.*

Borlaug Leadership Enhancement in Agriculture Program (LEAP) – A USAID-funded fellowship program aimed at supporting thesis research of graduate students from countries receiving U.S. AID funding, primarily from sub-Saharan Africa. Funding must relate to food, feed, and fiber production, processing, marketing, distribution, utilization, and trade, and also includes family and consumer sciences, nutrition, food science and engineering, agricultural economics and other social sciences, forestry, wildlife, fisheries, aquaculture, floriculture, veterinary medicine, and other environmental and natural resources sciences." *Last Deadline: October 25, 2010.*

National Gallery of Art's Center for Advanced Study in the Visual Arts Predoctoral Fellowships – To support doctoral dissertation research in the history, theory, and criticism of art, architecture, and urbanism. Application for these fellowships may be made only through the chair of graduate departments of art history and other appropriate departments, who act as sponsors for applicants from their respective schools. Awards are \$20,000 for 12 months for up to three years. Citizenship: unspecified. *Deadline: November 15 annually.*

III. B. (1) Funding Opportunities for International Research or to be Conducted Abroad

Social Science Research Council (SSRC)

● **Dissertation Proposal Development Fellowship (DPDF) Program** – A workshop designed to help graduate students in the humanities and social sciences formulate doctoral dissertation proposals. The workshop is organized around distinct “research fields” that vary yearly; the topics are announced in November. For doctoral students in the early phase of their research, generally second and third years. Funds participation in workshops and up to \$5,000 for research. **Deadline for student applications: January 28, 2012 for workshop on themes that will be announced in mid-November.** <http://www.ssrc.org/programs/dpdf/> and <http://www.ssrc.org/fellowships/dpdf-fellowship/>

● **International Dissertation Research Fellowship (IDRF)** – 75 fellowships for nine to 12 months (up to \$20,000) for students in the humanities and social sciences. Must have passed qualifying exams by the time the fellowship begins or by December 2010, whichever comes first.
