





The heading, PREFACE, would be in all capital letters and be centered one-inch from the top of the page. Then, following the spacing guidelines, begin the text. The text on this page must comply with margin requirements. This page is not included in the Table of Contents. It should be 1-2 pages in length, and it is not to contain any tables, figures, algorithms, schemes, or computer code. Finally, this page is numbered with a lower-case roman numeral.
